The Rector Writes ... VE Day—8th May

Dear Friends,

The 8th of May this year is the 80th anniversary of VE day – the second world war ended in Europe and the



Nazi's were defeated. The context of our celebrations will always be the horrors of the holocaust, and the memory of so many who died to stop the devastation, but we also come with gratitude and joy that wars can end, and that peace can come.

After the first world war we punished Germany. The reparations we demanded paved the way for the rise of Hitler and so much evil. We did need to confront and stop that evil. That evil needed exposing after the war. But after the second world war we also brought peace. Through the Marshall plan West Germany was re-built. And now we have had 80 years of peace in Western Europe.

We remember too how the troubles ended in Northern Ireland, Apartheid ended in South Africa, and how peace has come to the former Yugoslavia.

As I'm writing this I am preparing for Holy Week and Easter. We remember how Jesus confronted the bullies and the hypocrites, but without using violence. He paid the price of their anger when he died on the cross – and he prayed "Father forgive them, they don't know what they are doing." To his followers it seemed like a tragic end, but Easter Day followed Good Friday.

My prayer for Israel and the Gaza strip, and for Ukraine, is not just that evil can be confronted, but also that healing and forgiveness can come. That one day they will all be able to celebrate peace. And I do pray with hope, remembering how evil has been defeated and peace has come.
